### Trainer's Biography



**Dr. Kate Donohue**, is a licensed psychologist and a registered expressive arts therapist (REAT). She holds a Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology and has maintained an active private practice for 33 years.

She has also been teaching for 30 years, at such institutions as California Institute of Integral Studies, Institute for Transpersonal Psychology, JFK University and the San Francisco C.G. Jung Institute. She is a cofounder of the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association and a MCEP and CEU provider. She got the Shining Star Award presented by the IEATA in 2005 for her outstanding contributions to the expressive arts field.

Her work as an expressive arts therapist stems from her own deep and abiding passion for the arts. She is involved in visual arts and dance, having spent 18 years studying indigenous and ethnic dance forms, in particular West African and Afro-Cuban Dance. Her visual arts work in painting and drawing has helped her explore an interest in understanding the sacred feminine. She has a background in drama and poetics, and a great appreciation for music. Her involvement in arts and culture has made her own life richer, by allowing her to map and understand her own inner terrain. She has taught at workshops and conferences in the US and internationally and published in a variety of professional journals including *Arts and Psychotherapy Journal*, *San Francisco Jung Library Journal*, *Encyclopedia of Creativity* and *Poiesis Journal*.

### Learning Objectives

- The concept of the "participation mystique" and how it informs the intersubjective experience of an individual and the community.
- How the arts are integral in the development of the intersubjective experience of the individual and the community.
- How to access images in a variety of creative modalities, exploring their intrapsychic, interpersonal, and transpersonal aspects.
- An increased sense of comfort and appreciation for one's own bodily experience - its wisdom, intuitive, and feeling responses - toward enhancing self care and empathy and effectiveness in working with others.

#### Content

*"In the deepest sense, we all dream not of ourselves, but out of what lies between us and the other." - C.G. Jung*

- To open to the unknown and discover our wholeness
- To invite participants to engage in an expressive arts approach, exploring the intersubjective relationship between the individual and the collective that Jung understood as the participation mystique.
- To discover what evokes and nourishes relationship, illuminating the power of creativity and the participation mystique in this transformative process.
- To investigate how images hold intrapsychic, interpersonal, and transpersonal meaning for the individual and for the group

Concepts that will be examined include the participation mystique/intersubjective field, the power of images to evoke and explore the transcendent function, and a theoretical approach to weaving the arts into healing and transformative tapestries. Participants, individually and through group interaction, will then apply these concepts in an experiential process integrating Authentic Movement, Visual Arts, Drama and Poetry. We will discover ways each individual informs the collective and the collective informs the individual in the vibrant web of life.
